Her solo performance in *Hagar* (Alma Theatre) poignantly depicts a Syrian refugee experience. Amena has also embodied Sammar in F.O.B. and Nahla in Harun for the Edmonton Fringe. Other credits include E-Day (The Serial Collective), Rehearsal (Syrian Heritage Association), All That Binds Us (Azimuth Theatre), and Here There Be Night (Workshop West). An accomplished Arab playwright and actress, Amena's migration to Canada ignited her passion for storytelling.
